*Vs.* The just shall flourish like a sturdy palm tree,  
And he shall grow up like a Leb'non cedar,  
Planted in God's house, in the Lord's court dwelling. R

*Dox.* Praise now the Father, praise his Son Most Blessed,  
And Holy Spirit, Triune God for ever;  
With hosts of heaven, praise and give him glory. R

*Introit St. Joseph; adapted Luke Massery © 2020*  
*Tune:* ATTENDE DOMINE, 11 11 11 with refrain.
