Second Sunday of Lent

 $\sqrt[V]{1}$ I will ponder your commands which I have loved deeply, I will lift up my hands toward your law. \mathbb{R} $\sqrt[V]{2}$ In my heart I meditate upon your commandments, it is these I exceedingly love. \mathbb{R}

Third Sunday of Lent

 $\sqrt[V]{}$ 1 What the Lord ordains is right, it gladdens all people, bringing joy to the hearts of his own. \mathbb{R} $\sqrt[V]{}$ 2 For the precepts of the Lord are sweeter than honey, and your servant will follow them all. \mathbb{R}

Fourth Sunday of Lent

 $\sqrt[V]$ 1 Praise the Lord, for he is good, his name shall be honored; sing to God for his mercy and love. \mathbb{R} $\sqrt[V]$ 2 God accomplishes his will, on earth and in heaven - everything that his will has ordained. \mathbb{R}

<u>After the Gospel of The Prodigal Son is Read, sing this verse:</u> $\sqrt[7]{V}$ 3 Lord, illuminate my eyes, that death may not take me, lest my foe shall say "I have prevailed."

Fifth Sunday of Lent

 $\sqrt[7]{V}$ 1 I will praise you, O my Lord, my whole heart will praise you, deal with me in your bountiful love. \mathbb{R} $\sqrt[7]{V}$ 2 May I live and follow you, observing your precepts: give me life in accord with your word. \mathbb{R}
